## **Facilitator-Leaders**

**Iulia Corduneanu Curtright** owes her theological formation to both her native Romania and her "new land." Leaping in faith from engineering school for a M.Div. degree from the University of Iasi in Romania, her new path led to a Th.M. from Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology and post-graduate studies at Marquette University. Married to Fr. Mark Curtright, a Greek Orthodox priest serving in Kansas City, Kansas, they are the parents of Anna and Mariam. Committed to striving to understand and apply in her daily life (as a mother and wife) the ecclesiological gift of the "liturgy after the Liturgy", she is also learning that *being* an Orthodox woman is first and foremost the experience of kneeling at the foot of the Cross.

Christine Halikias, a long-time student of Orthodox Christian spirituality, is committed to learning about and facilitating healthy responses for individuals and communities surviving various types of distress, injustice, trauma and/or abuse. She has studied at Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology and William James College. As mother of five-year old Maria, she is married to Fr. Philip Halikias, assistant priest of Holy Archangels Greek Orthodox Church in Watertown, MA. Presbytera Christine was recently accepted for graduate studies in Social Work in the MSW program at Boston University. She is looking forward to beginning this September.
